

Grades attended at ECS

I was a student at ECS starting in 1970 through 1980- Kindergarten through 9th grade. I attended ECS at the previous campus.

Favorite teacher at ECS

We had so many great teachers at ECS back in the day. My 1st grade teacher was Mrs. McMahon-who I will never forget. Some of my favorite middle school teachers included Mr. Brownlee (Social Studies), Mr. Kinkaid (English and PE), and Mr. Forvilly (Math.)

Favorite memory while at ECS

At the end of every school year, we got to do something called "Outdoor Education" -- or as we all called it "Outdoor Ed." We packed the entire middle school into our school buses and went on a weeklong fieldtrip to cool places all over Oregon. I remember visiting Fort Clatsop, the tide pools along the northern coastline, dozens of museums, and many of our state parks. At night, we camped in tents at various campsites along the way. We played capture the flag and flag football, and we sang songs around the campfire. For a middle school boy back then, that was pretty cool. I also really enjoyed playing team sports every year for our school. Our soccer / football field and our gym were both very small, but WE didn't know that. We had the best time playing against other small schools in our area (in each sport) every year.

How did your time at ECS prepare you for the future (spiritually and educationally)?

After leaving ECS, I went on to Churchill High School (Go Lancers!) I was amazed at how well I was prepared for high school from an academic standpoint.

My education at ECS allowed me to enroll in upper-level courses immediately -- which gave me the opportunity to enroll in several AP classes as an upper classman. Completing the AP classes at Churchill resulted in almost a year of college credit coming out of high school. Spiritually, ECS gave me the confidence as a young Christian man to know who I was and who I wanted to be later in life. When I look back now on the things we learned in Bible Class, I realize how much of a privilege it was to learn about the Lord every day in school. ECS provided the spiritual foundation that God continues to build on in my everyday life.

Looking back, what advice would you give to current ECS students?

Start as early as you can and stay as long as you can. ECS is a "Christ-protected" campus where you can not only learn about God but get an amazing education. In a world that's hard to navigate from a Christian perspective sometimes, ECS is a place where you get the opportunity to set your spiritual compass for life.

What is your occupation?

I am the co-owner (with my brother, Curt) of Meili Construction. Our grandfather started the company. It was passed down to our dad, and now to us. At Meili Construction, we get to build grocery stores, affordable housing, single-family homes, warehouses, medical facilities, and occasionally, schools. In June of 2012, we began renovations to a large commercial printing facility on Chad Drive that, before the next school year, would become the current Eugene Christian School campus. As an alumni, to have the opportunity to take an active part of growing ECS at a new location is indescribable. While all of us loved the previous campus, the new campus is providing even more opportunities for an even greater number of students today.

What was it like for you to be a part of the latest construction projects here at ECS as our enrollment continues to expand?

It has been so exciting to watch the growth at ECS the last 12 years. We were so thankful to have been invited back (a couple of times) to create more classrooms inside the building footprint as student enrollment has increased. And maybe it's just the builder in me, but I don't think God is finished growing Eugene Christian School. God has been blessing ECS and our families for several generations. If we keep our eyes focused on him, I'm confident he will continue to bless our school for many more generations to come.
